Bachelor Degree requirements for ETSU

- Earn a minimum of 120 semester credit hours
 - At least 50 of these hours must be at a 4-year college or university (excluding community colleges)
 - At least 25% of the total hours required for the degree must be taken at ETSU (30 hours for the 120-hour program, etc.)
 - At least six hours in the major must be completed at ETSU
- All students must have a transfer GPA of 2.0 to graduate with a degree from ETSU
